<u>President's Report</u> - <u>Effie E. Pressley</u> – Effie discussed a change to Vince Belluscio's position to "Consultant to the TCTANJ". Effie referenced his vast institutional knowledge as an asset to the organization with still much to contribute.

Effie also stated that all professional contracts will be sent to the membership prior to the January meeting for review & transparency. Margaret Saharic will be stepping in as "Interim Executive Director". Effie wanted everyone to keep Vince, Mark and all our members in their prayers. She also wanted to thank all the members, past presidents, the Board, and all current members who take pride in our profession. She then wished everyone Happy Holidays.

# **Executive Director's Report** – No report

Counsel's Report – Keith Bonchi- thanked Maureen Cosgrove and Sonia Schulman, along with the rest of the team for pushing through S4142. Also wanted to thank Lori Epstein for the introduction on November 30, 2023. There has been no In-Rem foreclosures since May because of the Tyler v. Hennepin County ruling. Foreclosures cannot move because there has been no movement on the bill. He asked Sonia Schulman to speak to Senator Stack about expediting the bill. Since the legislature is currently in lame duck, laws are passed without much discussion such as the Vacant Property law. We need to make sure that the correct bill is passed with regards to Tyler. Also, they are looking to change the amount of attorney fees in foreclosures because those are capped at \$500.00 which is only a fraction of the actual costs. They are pushing to get reasonable legal fees and the cost of the Sheriff Sale introduced into the courts as the lienholders are losing money with foreclosures. This will have terrible ramifications to municipalities since we will then lose bidders.

If a homeowner does not request a Sheriff Sale, there will be no presumed equity in the property. Also, last Monday, there was a motion to vacate a foreclosure in Paterson caused by the Tyler case. The appellate Court said that Tyler applies to New Jersey for both the towns and the lienholders. It is not retroactive. He also stated that the amount of bidders are down throughout New Jersey and Premiums are getting readjusted. He stated we need reasonable Counsel fees or we will not be getting lienholders.

<u>Membership Services Director – Rita Carr –</u> 2024 forms are available and going out January 1. Currently there are 707 for \$69,575.00 – stated we are staying even. Paul Lesniak then reported that he was working with the GFOA in trying to send out TCTANJ membership applications to their members so that they can also join our organization. John Antonides said that he would discuss it with the new president of the GFOA.

## <u>Division of Local Government Services – No report</u>

<u>Rutgers's Report – Pam Morley-Chappelle –</u> There are currently 109 students and 29 in the review classes. The full spring schedule is available and classes will run from January 27 – June 1. All course remain virtual and they are trying to develop courses to be more interactive. They will be using the Canvass platform. They hired instructional designs and they are meeting with instructors to make interactive. They are still looking for 2 more instructors and will be conducting interviews next week. She stated that the courses are more difficult online and so they are looking to make the classes smaller.
